this modern classic celebrates the tradition of tamales and family bonding at christmas. christmas eve started out so perfectly for maria. snow had fallen and the streets glittered. maria's favorite cousins were coming over and she got to help make the tamales for christmas dinner. it was almost too good to be true when her mother left the kitchen for a moment and maria got to try on her beautiful diamond ring. this is the story of a treasure thought to be lost in a batch of tamales. a desperate and funny attempt by maria and her cousins to eat their way out of trouble and the warm way a family pulls together to make it a perfect christmas. after all, also available in spanish as *qué montón de tamales*.

writing is all about making meaning. the prospect of teaching writing to a classroom full of students some who speak english and some who don't can be overwhelming when students learning english are at different levels. the task is even more challenging writing

sense integrated reading and writing lessons for english language learners outlines the classroom conditions necessary for successful writing instruction with english language learners whether in writing workshop and or small group instruction it includes 68 classroom tested lessons for grades k 8 that show kids at all levels of language acquisition how to make connections ask questions visualize make mental images infer determine importance synthesize monitor meaning and comprehension and use fix up strategies the five main sections are geared to the stages of language proficiency and lessons are divided into younger and older students spanning kindergarten through to grade eight there are extensive lists of suggested books for mentor texts as well as lists of mentor authors to facilitate teachers planning and instruction

the authors provide strategies examples and tools to address the gap between ells and texts socio cultural differences between teachers and ells and language differences between ells and peers

get books moving off the library shelves and into the hands of children with this integrated package for thematic instruction sixteen chapters based on such lively themes as risky reading adventure stories horrendous fun monster stories and book line and sinker ocean world contain introductions to the themes introductory activities booktalks annotated bibliographies and reproducible activity pages that extend learning across the curriculum activities are coded by grade level a valuable tool for cooperative planning between librarians and teachers this book helps librarians choose present and promote book titles appropriate to specific themes it also helps teachers plan corresponding activities grades k 3
